Potter Richard Zane Smith (above right) is expected to sell well this summer at Gallery 10. "He's doing demos that have really inspired people to buy pottery," says gallery owner Phil Cohen. "These are hand-coiled pots and people are fascinated by the process."

The "hot" artist this summer at Columbine Gallery at Hotel Loretto is not a sculptor but a painter. Alyson Kinkade (above left) is making abstract work that is "fresh, powerful, lyrical and attracts a wide audience," a gallery representative said. There will be a new body of work on hand in the gallery for the summer crowds visiting this primarily sculpture gallery.
